TAWAU: The Energy Commission has completed the first phase of its Touch Point 2 Corporate Social Responsibility in five religious and welfare institutions in the East Coast.

The CSR programme was held to refurbish, repair and install electrical wiring on residential premises and the work was carried out by competent technicians and registered contractors.

Its East Coast Director Mohd Yusrul Yusof said the programme involved three institutions from Sandakan and two more from the Ad-Diniah Ar-Rahmaniah Madrasah in Sungai Imam Bombalai and the Poor and Orphan Home in Tanah Merah Merotai.

"The programme also looked into con-

tributing electrical appliances like lamps, fans and other efficient energy use equipment in the premises.

"It also involved carrying out talks on electricity safety, saving on energy and efficient energy use by residents," he said.

Mohd Yusrul said this during the launching of the Smart Energy Seminar here on Wednesday.

A total of three seminar papers were presented involving the introduction of the Energy Commission and its role, safety and dangers of electricity, energy saving tips and others.

He hoped the seminar will raise awareness among consumers on power consumption safety and practice of efficient energy use.
